4. Cycling Issues - Rob Fairbanks, Director, Surrey Hills AONB

Rob gave an overview of the AONB which covers around 25% of the county. The AONB runs the Surrey Hills Mountain Bike Working Group to help influence the impact of this activity. The area around Leith Hill – Peaslake is a magnet for MTB'ers. Working with other parties they helped create the dedicated MTB route on Leith Hill which has led to the number of complaints about mountain biking going down dramatically. The NT are supportive and working with Sustrans they are looking to create a network of down-hill MTB trails linking in other routes, some of which may be more family-friendly. They have also established the Surrey Hills Trust Fund to help manage existing trails and

fund new ones. Rob also proposed the removal of white lines down the centre of lanes to help reinforce the idea of a shared space.

At this point the floor was handed over to David Preedy who will be representing Parish Councils on the Surrey Cycling Board which will be responsible for monitoring the implementation of the Surrey Cycling Strategy. David offered to keep us "in the loop" with respect to this board.

For the Box Hill and Headley area he noted the main issue is on-road cycling and the sheer number of organised events. Whilst roads are only closed for Ride London, there are 18 other weekends when events are scheduled, and in between there are many cyclists checking out or practising on the route. Apparently the Zig Zag Road features as the second most regularly cycled climb on Strava. The profile of the residents of the area is such that they often feel intimidated by the numbers, even though only a small minority of cyclists behave badly.

5. Surrey Cycling Strategy - Mole Valley Local Cycling Plan

Mole Valley Cycle Event

RT spoke to Becky Willson (SCC Cycling Officer) about the follow up to the Mole Valley cycling event: They are currently collating the responses and adding them to a map which will be available for further comment from the public at another event to be held during the summer. The final outcome will then be taken to the Local Committee. More recently Becky has reported that they may piggy-back onto an event MVDC are planning on Saturday 19th September. Whilst the focus of this event is on responsible dog-ownership, they are keen to tie in the walking for health scheme and therefore cycling *might* fit well with this too.

MVCF Cycle Scheme Priorities

SCC has no definitive list of priorities as such although the Cycling Strategy gives good pointers. A lot depends on where the funding comes from. Currently schemes that deliver Sustainability and Economic Growth are seen as important. The preference is for high quality off-road / off-carriageway or wide shared-use paths, as these are seen as the only way to attract new cycle users.

Leatherhead-Ashtead Cycle Path

A number of issues have been rectified here, so a further review may be in order. It would be interesting to see the data from the cycle counters to see the take-up.

Safe Routes to Schools (Howard of Effingham)

RB noted that JD has submitted a comprehensive report to the planning application for the new school.

Dorking Centre - Meadowback links

RB, RT and RS attended a positive meeting with other MVDC officers and consultants at the end of May. **RS** offered to talk to John Menlove to find out if there are any updates.

Transform Leatherhead

From the forum 's perspective the key improvements involve widening/extending the cycle path between Deepdene Station and Dorking Station. This consultation closes on Fri 31 July.

11. AOB

EP queried if there was a new edition of the Highway Code, as there was some query over the passing distance for vehicle overtaking cycles. NB. The Highway Code is available online at: https://www.gov.uk/highway-code/contents RT raised a couple of issues received by email from Rob Hedgecock, and has responded on the NCN22 issues.
